Senior Pastor's Report

We embarked into 2020 with all good intentions. We kicked off our events with a First Responders' Sunday, our first wedding conducted in our Sunday service, then our church's 33rd birthday celebrations. We were anticipating our biggest Easter with Dr. Hugh and Kathy Ross, of *Reasons To Believe*, planned as our special guests, but we had to



'pivot' as our State went into lockdown. Ian Watts was able to organise with Reasons To Believe the technology needed to have Dr. Ross live on our webcast and for us to be able to interview him live as well. Several thousand people joined us online for this event.



Even though we had been live-streaming our Sunday services for quite a while, we felt it necessary to adapt our live-stream during the lockdown. This included changing the language we used from *viewing to participating, listening to worshiping, watching to connecting*. This

is why we chose not to record our worship, but to deliver it live. It's why we also chose to have Karen Dickson and Louise Filleul interact live with those participating in our live-stream, and it's why we chose to deliver God's Word live rather than have it recorded. Our motive was to replicate as much as possible of what the Scripture teaches about being the church that comes together to worship God together, fellowship with each other, encourage one another, pray for each other, and minister to one another. During the live-stream only lockdown period, we were averaging around one thousand device connections each week - and had many reports of friends, family members, and neighbours who hadn't normally been attending church, engaging with our live-stream. We have good reasons to be proud of the efforts of our worship team led by Janette Boyle and Tom Ferguson, our Media Team led by Ian Watts, our Audio Team led by Jared Nielsen, and our Kids Church team (who each prepared separate simultaneous videos for the Kids Church live-stream). I'm also thankful to the pulpit team who prayerfully delivered communion and offering messages each week and for pastors Donna and Tony who supplemented the preaching of God's Word.

While we were in lockdown for several months, the staff continued to conduct our weekly staff meetings via Zoom as we sought to ensure that we were able to care for and shepherd everyone in our church community. Pastor Donna did a sterling job mobilising the Care-Team to provide meals, practical aid, and listening ears to our church community throughout the lockdown. We also took advantage of the lockdown and resurfaced our car-park, had Ronny Darby construct a undercover connecting walkway between the C.E.C. and the main building, repainted the foyer, renovated the administration office, and organised for a creche to be constructed in the auditorium, and new kitchen to be installed.



As the lockdown came to an end we planned to relaunch our Sunday services in a grand fashion. We were asked by the Heads of Churches in Tasmania to thank the Premier and Health Minister on behalf of the churches of Tasmania in a special Thanksgiving Sunday where we presented the Premier with a special plaque of appreciation from the churches of Tasmania, and a bouquet of flowers to the Health Minister. Heads of Churches from around Tasmania contributed a brief video greeting and message of thanks to Premier Peter Gutwein and Health Minister Sarah Courtney. I'm sure that for all those present on that special Sunday, they would agree, that the Premier was deeply and obviously appreciative of the support and prayers that he felt from the churches of Tasmania.

Our year finished well with a loosening of the COVID restrictions for Christmas services which enabled us to host 275 people for our community carols BBQ and Roast lunch which became a nice bookend to our year after our events at the start of the year.





I hope that we are all thankful to the wonderful team leaders we have been blessed with at Legana who serve on staff, run home groups, youth group activities, service attendant coordination, and help with our catering. We are truly blessed! And I especially want to thank our church community who wonderfully encouraged and prayed for me throughout 2020. Your support, financially, prayerfully, and practically, enabled us to not only survive 2020, but advance through 2020. Thank you.

Audio Team Leader's Report



Over the past year with the COVID-19 restrictions being introduced, our audio team was faced with the biggest challenges we had ever seen. Almost over night we had seen our church services go from having a large congregation each week to being “livestream only” for a number of months. This meant we had to take our attention away from live audio mixes for our auditorium and move our entire focus to our livestream audio. Although we have now been live-streaming our services for many years now this still proved to be challenging. We had the introduction of using Zoom to communicate with church members during our services and in particular with Hugh Ross for our Easter services. We needed to come up with the best way to provide communication both ways and also provide that audio for everyone listening at home. Aspects like this meant to were figuring things out as we went to make our livestream services happen smoothly.

With the challenges faced in 2020 it has still left us with many benefits we are still using today. We were forced to investigate to best possible ways to provide audio for our livestream and we were able to upgrade our equipment for streaming audio online.



We have since received so much positive feedback on the quality of our livestream audio since our services were livestream only. It also meant we have been reaching more people than we ever have through our livestream in our community and all over the world. We are always looking to bring more volunteers into our team so if audio is an area of interest for you please feel free to see me.

Kids' Church Report


We kicked off the year with our team leaders planning meeting in January. It is our prayer at Legana KiDs that we would help our kids to know, love and grow in their walk with God through reading his word, the Bible. We hope that our kids will understand the 'why' and 'how' to read the Bible. The 'how' looked very different for our three groups Chillies (Grade Five and Six), Choc-Chips- (1-4) and the Jellybeans (3yrs to Prep) and we made the reading and learning of God's word fun and engaging! At KiDs church we strive to provide a safe environment where



children can enjoy learning about God. Our worship includes singing, celebrating birthdays, collecting offering, games/quizzes/sharing and prayer time before moving into our different groups.

KiDs Church Online

Praise God that not even the outbreak of COVID-19 pandemic could stop us from sharing about our great God with the children at Legana KiDs and even beyond our immediate vicinity! 2020 was sure a year of challenges for us all, but I am so grateful for the team of leaders who are passionate about sharing God's love! So, in March when we had to go into lock down, we all became quite tech savvy thanks to Pastor Andrew, Ian Watts and the technical team at Legana Church. We quickly learned how to create and record our lessons and engage with our Kids via our Legana KiDs online portal. Our online program was a replica of our face-to-face program with a whole group welcome, song, quizzes, prayer, offering, story time and/or activity sheet and a demonstration video of a craft children could do at home. We encouraged parents to guide their children through our



church website with links to Chillies, Choc Chips and Jellybeans groups where we had videos and activities prepared each by our team leaders. We also had a chat forum with a team leader present online to answer questions that kids had. The feedback from children and parents was positive and very encouraging. The online platform enabled parents to engage in the main church service while their children carried on with their program or they could do the activities with their children at a later time.

Back to Face-to-Face KiDs Church

The children, leaders and, I believe, parents were excited when the church announced that we could return to face-to-face church practicing social distancing. We all embraced this and encouraged our kids to practice good hygiene and maintain their personal space as much as we could. It was an exciting celebration back to worshipping God together in CEC!

To adapt to the Covid-19 Safe requirements and the use of our space, we trialled and continued to use a combined group approach for our program for the Choc-Chip and Jellybeans groups making use of the bigger space. We used 'God's story' 3-6 and 5-7 curriculum and adapted this to suit our combined age groups. Our Chillies group still had their own room/space for their program.



Hygiene Kits \$115
Provide 10 children with the essential resources and supplies for basic hygiene practices to help protect them and their families from COVID-19 and other illnesses.

Outreach opportunities: The Annual Launceston Alive Family Easter Festival at the City Park was cancelled and so we were unable to take part in this event in 2020.

Our giving is an important part of our worship and outreach. Through our offerings at Legana KiDs church, we have encouraged the kids to give to support different ministries. In 2020, through our offering we raised enough to provide clean water and buy 10 mosquito nets for children less privileged through Compassion Ministry. In Term 3 and 4, we raised

enough to buy four Bibles to be sent to Children who do not have Bibles through Compassion Ministry. We encourage parents to encourage their children to give a little from their pocket money or savings to support other children who may not be as privileged as we are. We hope to plan to raise enough to buy hygiene kits for at least 20 children in 2021.

2020 was a year of adjustment and change as we faced as a church a sudden turnaround in world events that would change every facet of our lives. The Worship Team at Legana Christian Church also, becoming a part of this change. However, we can choose to look at the problems that the world can throw our way as a time to look at opportunities and points of positive change for God's Kingdom and I believe that is what we have achieved over 2020.

We started the year with a special new series that incorporated weekly events in February, which the team rose to and presented some quality items and reflective pieces. However, by March, COVID 19 had started to impact all of our lives and over half the team needed to go into a hard lockdown for various reasons. I was personally impacted by this as my daughter (who had a Liver Transplant as a child and is on immunosuppressive drugs) was suddenly flown home from Victoria to self isolate with us. I am so glad of the team of Music Directors that helped me facilitate my role at Legana and particularly want to thank Alistair Strating and Tom Ferguson for helping to keep the Worship Team moving along with new worship songs and items during this time. We periodically met as a group of music directors on Zoom and were, therefore, able to continue to introduce new songs to the church setlist as our services moved online; such as:

Eventually, quite a number of us were able to also take part in our online services again and items were presented by a number of team members such as Tom/ Eloise Ferguson, April Strating/Ruby Corbett, Louise Dickson/Azahlia Dingemane, and Azahlia/Peter Dingemane.

These items were well appreciated and gave a sense of normalcy in what was a very uncertain time. Amazingly during this time, the team also experienced growth in members with Judith McIntosh and Cathy de la Motte joining the team

and Laura Boyle + Eloise Ferguson rejoining us; welcome. We also farewelled Wendy Jago during this time and wish her all the best.

Coming back together as a church though, was quite exciting and it was wonderful to have an almost full compliment on stage to present a celebration of God's goodness in worship to not only our church but to also our Premier Peter Gutwein, State Health Minister, State Minister for Infrastructure and West Tamar Council Mayor. It really was a great morning of celebration.

During this time, we also started to bring back some of our well-known events such as Home Grown Sunday, which featured songs written by Team Members such as Judith McIntosh, Louise Dickson/Azahlia Dingemanse, Ross Mace; plus Jennifer Hepher in our congregation. Eventually, however, I personally felt that this year was signalling change, not only globally, but in my own life, and felt it was time to step down in the role that I had been given. For the last quarter of 2020, Tom Ferguson has very ably stepped into the role as Worship Team Leader and so far done a brilliant job. I would like to wish him all the best in his new role and pray that he will know the hand of God in everything he pursues as a Leader of the Worship Team.

From Thomas Ferguson-



First of all, it has been an honour and a pleasure to serve our community for the past few months as Legana Christian Church's Worship Team Director. I am – as I'm sure the wider Church community and Worship Team is also – grateful to Janette Boyle's tutelage of the Worship Team over

the past 4 years, and especially over the past year in navigating a turbulent teaching year (in her professional capacity) and simultaneously organising worship services in the era of COVID-19. Her consistency and reliability are assets which I hope to emulate.

The challenges of the previous year are evident to all. Nevertheless, the Worship Team adjusted to each change with relative ease and supported one another admirably. There was a sense amongst the team that – as we had the privilege of attending the Church building each week whilst the congregation was at home – we had a responsibility to ensure that our worship continued to be uplifting and that we could never cease worshiping our God despite the difficult circumstances. I applaud each member of the team in conducting themselves so diligently.

Financially, we continue to spend modestly and focus our allocated funds on expenses which are necessary to the team's functioning. In the past year and in the present one, we have allocated some funds to purchase new musical equipment (primarily electronic instruments which



would allow us to expand our sonic repertoire) but have yet to use these funds to do so. We will continue to research the most cost-effective options to this end, as such an investment must be practical, affordable and sound pleasant (there are plenty of options which fit only some – if any – of these criteria).



Given that our team is based on members of our Church volunteering their time to participate in the Worship Team (making the past year's response to COVID-19 restrictions all the more impressive), our opportunities to meet together are generally limited and consist mostly of concentrating on the week's

upcoming service. However, I hope to recommence special gatherings which focus on areas of specific interest, such as (for example) vocalist and guitarist workshops. (These sessions had been prevented from operating in the past year.)

We currently have 23 regularly participating (at least once a month) Worship Team members – approximately half of whom are singers. This means that we often struggle to have well-rounded teams on each week; this has been an ongoing issue. Ideally, for the team to run more smoothly, we will need to recruit about 7 more regular participating volunteers, especially instrumentalists.

Proficient musicians are always great assets to our team, but younger musicians should not refrain from putting up their hand to play – we provide all sorts of avenues for learning and offer many opportunities for them to cultivate their skills.

Going forward, the Worship Team will continue to focus on creating a space for worship and presenting ourselves to God in praise and worship – that is our chief goal and one that will never be compromised nor superseded. Nonetheless, this year a greater emphasis has been placed on producing music which is both pleasing to the ear and conducive to a worshipful atmosphere. This entails that we pay close attention to every small detail and ensure that we produce an excellent sound.



I believe that it is perfectly consistent to recognise that our main priority is to offer praise and worship to God, but also that our music ought to be of a high quality – it is not my belief that one comes at the expense of the other. Indeed, I believe that excellence in music (as in any art) is an incredibly special

way to express our worship to God. I am reminded of Johan Sebastian Bach (of whom it is entertaining to quote at dinner parties) in this regard, who understood the creation of music as a meaningful demonstration of devotion to God:

“The aim and final end of all music should be none other than the glory of God and the refreshment of the soul.”

In all, the priority of our Worship Team will remain the same: each week we will gather with our Church community to offer our worship to God – the God who ordered the world so that we might study its beauty to return its glory to him in praise. Out of that reverence and honour grows a desire to create beautiful and meaningful music solely in the service of our great God!

Media & Video Team

The video team creates quality content for Legana's DVD series of sermons, live broadcast of services, online videos, social media content, weekly news and other special event material. This covers the operating and setup of cameras for video shoots, whether at a service or for special videos, and editing of this content into deliverables for web, live or DVD media.



Process



The most common practise for the video team is the Sunday morning service sermons and livestream. This involves one person as the 'director', arriving an hour before the service, setting up the three cameras, checking the audio mix and preparing the live broadcast and recording a backup on the computer. Another team member assists once the sermon has started, operating the cameras in the Church under the instruction of the director as required. For special events the same type of camera and personnel can be utilised to create a sermon/speech style presentation. The team also creates interviews for special occasions. These videos are often bigger productions involving pre-production, lighting and audio setups and lengthy post-production and editing.

2020 Progress

2020 has been a big year for the video team! The March 2020 outbreak of COVID-19 presented us with many challenges, the most urgent being a rethink of how we present church when we could not meet in person. This saw the development of the studio which we utilised throughout the remainder of March, April, May, June, July and August



until our relaunch with a congregation present. In conjunction with Pastor Andrew, Jared Neilsen (audio team) and Alex Neilsen (data team) Ian Watts lead the video team to develop the livestream into a reliable online church service. This continued as we recommenced meeting in person and has benefited from the many improvements we have made during the COVID lockdown period.

In 2021 the video team will be looking to continue to grow its team, maintain the new level of content produced and up-skill existing members into more responsibility. We are also looking to improve the livestream in manageable steps whether by the purchasing of new gear or implementing new techniques.
