Reflection

J. Warner Wallace was a third generation cop. Although he graduated from the Los Angeles Sheriff's Explorer Academy in 1978, he actually went on to study graphic design at California State University earning a bachelor's degree, the a master's degree in architecture from the University of California, Los Angeles. In 1979 he married his sweetheart, Suzie. (They would go on to have four children.) But then in 1988 he left his career in design and returned to pursuing a career as a policeman. J. Warner (Jim) served with Torrance Police Department on assignments with the SWAT (Special Weapons And Tactics) team, Gang Detail, and the Robbery Homicide squad. But the wear and tear on his body from being in the SWAT team took a toll on Jim and he then became one of the founding members of the Torrance Police Department's *Cold-Case Homicide Unit*.

It seemed that J. Warner Wallace was unusually wired to solve murder mysteries - particularly, cold-case murders (previously unsolved murder cases that happened years ago). His ability to investigate and prosecute the murderers of these cold-cases soon earned him national acclaim in the United States where he was profiled on TV crime shows such as *Dateline* (NBC) and Fox 11 *truTV*

(formerly called *Court TV*). In his twenty-year career as a cold-case homicide detective, remarkably everyone he charged with a murder, *was* found guilty and sentenced for murder. In 2015 he was recognised by the *California Peace Officer Association* with an award for the best solved cold case.

Despite coming from a family background that was associated with Mormonism, Jim was an atheist. This concerned Suzie, not because she necessarily wanted her young family to become religious, but because she was concerned that their children needed a strong moral influence in their lives *apart* from their parents. She suggested to Jim that she should enrol their kids in a church's Sunday School. Jim was aghast at the thought of this. And Suzie suggested



that they try Saddleback Community Church. The first Sunday that he went with Suzie to this church and he was taken back by the intellectual depth of the pastor as he preached about Jesus *being the most intelligent man who ever walked the planet*. This provoked Jim to apply his investigative training and skills to investigate Christ and Christianity. What he discovered changed his life.



In 1996 J.Warner Wallace came to Christ when he was 35. His experience as a detective enabled him to take a natural interest in the evidence for the claims of Christianity which is often identified as apologetics. He would go on to earn a Master's

degree in theological studies and eventually write five books about the evidence for Christianity after starting a weekly blog and podcast called *Cold Case Christianity*.

The Role of Investigating Truth Claims

J.Warner Wallace states in every cold-case murder conviction he secured, he was never able to answer *every* question about the murder. At times this even included having a "no body" murder case! He states, "In every case I prosecuted and got a conviction, all I had was 'circumstantial evidence'. That is, he had *enough* evidence - *and no evidence to the contrary* - that his suspect was guilty.

Someone may have heard some good evidence for the truthfulness of God, yet still have unanswered questions. What do you think are the minimum questions that need to be answered in order to believe in God?
